NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION:

1. A description of each activity, including the need, purpose, objective(s), milestones and location. Include map showing the location of each activity.

This is an update to Hernando County's initial RESTORE Act Multiyear Implementation Plan (MYIP), accepted by Treasury on 8/6/2015. Hernando Beach Shallow Water Reef Project activity has been deleted. Linda Pederson Park Improvements Project is revised to increase Direct Component funds and change the scope of work to change replacement of existing seawall to replacement of an existing retaining wall and add replacement of swim platform.

Need

Hernando Beach Shallow Water Reef Project was completed with local funding availability prior to receipt of grant award.

Linda Pederson Park Improvements Project: The Jenkins spring run located within Linda Pederson Park has an existing retaining wall, boardwalk and condemned swim platform that need repair and replacement. The existing boat launch facilities at this park consists of a boat ramp and dock system constructed to provide access to a mix of recreational watercraft including motorized and non-motorized alike. This regional coastline park needs a non-motorized boat launch facility to allow canoes and kayaks to take advantage of the spring run as well as access to the Gulf of Mexico coastline. Integration of a canoe and kayak launch into the existing retaining wall, boardwalk area and swim platform will provide the benefit necessary to meet this need.

Purpose:

The purpose of this project is to provide additional direct component funding due to increase in project costs and replacement of boardwalk attached swim platform that has been condemned and removed since initial submission and approval of initial MYIP. The canoe/kayak launch was funded and installed with local funds. The addition of non-motorized boat launch facilities along the Hernando coastline will provide opportunities to expand the canoe and kayak offerings publicized through the County's Tourism office. The new launching facility and improved spring run area will be integrated into the County's "Florida's Adventure Coast, Brooksville Weeki Wachee" advertising campaign.

2. Hernando County determined that the most effective way to obtain broad-based participation from the entire community was to take the following approach:

Restore Act web page moved to new HC web site Posted the proposed plan amendment and a request for public comment to a dedicated page on the County website focusing on the RESTORE Act and County involvement. The page includes links to the actual Multi Year Implementation Plan (MYIP) and proposed Amendment #1 to the initial Multi Year Implementation Plan, an e-mail address to submit comments to County staff, a link to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection site that explains the RESTORE Act and its impact on the Gulf Coast, as well as a link to the US Treasury RESTORE Act web page. This collection of web sites and links to information on the RESTORE Act is virtually a one-stop shop for the public to learn about, submit comments on and to stay informed regarding the status of the RESTORE Act and the important connection to Hernando County.

Consideration was given to having bilingual staff members present the proposed plan in Spanish, however, based on past experience resulting in virtually no public turnout to this type of venue, it was determined to not be a worthwhile endeavor.

This project meets the eligibility requirements by promoting tourism and recreational fishing in the Gulf Coasty Region. Linda Pederson Park will be marketed as part of the County's "Adventure Coast, Nature's Place to Play" tourism marketing program and is featured as a site for our "Canoe and Kayak Trail" adventure.

4. Criteria the applicant will use to evaluate the success of the activities included in the multiyear plan narrative in helping to restore and protect the Gulf Coast Region impacted by the Deepwater Horizon oil spill.

In 2014 and estimated 1.7 million visitors traveled to Hernando County. The focus of the upcoming "Florida's Adventure Coast, Nature's Place to Play" tourism marketing campaign is to promote nature and water-based activities. This non-motorized watercraft launch will be featured in the campaign, which aims to increase tourism by five percent each year. The launch facility will be monitored to determine frequency of use and number of daily users. Annual campaign survey will be conducted to determine increase in use and interest from kayak and canoe visitors.
