STREET SIGN INSTALLATIONS

POLICY NO. 20-01

PURPOSE: To provide a uniform policy relating

to the installation and maintenance

of street name signs.

POLICY: 1. The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining existing street name signs on known maintained roadways.

- 2. Existing intersections that have never received street name signage are reviewed to determine if they are on a maintained right of way intersecting with a public dedicated right of way. The intersections of two non-maintained roadways are not signed by the Public Works Department. If a citizen desires to sign a non-maintained intersection, they will be apprised of the type and sources to obtain such signs at their expense (approximately \$40.00) for installation by them.
- 3. New roadways and intersections created by developers are signed and maintained by said developers at their cost per County development ordinances. When a new development receives "Final Acceptance" from the County, after two years, the Public Works Department assumes maintenance responsibility for those areas not maintained by a homeowner's association.
