### KASS CIRCLE BUSINESS SURVEY


- 19 question survey

Kass Circle and the surrounding areas have a variety of different businesses and industries serving the community



#### NUMBER OF YEARS LOCATED IN KASS CIRCLE




#### Percentage of Employers by Total Number of Employees





Percentage of Companies doing business online



## RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE KASS CIRCLE FOR BUSINESS COMMUNITY



- Condition of commercial plazas
- Better signage and access from Spring Hill Drive
- Improve area surrounding commercial plazas landscaping, blighted homes, etc.
- Address homeless issues
- Attract more popular businesses
- Address safety concerns
- Incentives by shop owners to rent vacant storefronts
- Address methadone clinic issues
- Imaging and marketing

# WAYS THAT THE CRA PLANNING PROCESS CAN HELP

- Working on comprehensive signage and wayfinding plan
- Developing homeless continuum of care with homeless service providers
- Encouraging more involvement of the Hernando County Sheriff's Office through a stronger Community Oriented Policing strategy
- Coordinating with Small Business Development Center, Chamber of Commerce, and Economic Development Department on funding and training opportunities
- Helping neighborhood create its own identity bringing increased recreational and social opportunities to residents to enhance quality of life
