




Confirmed sinkholes



► Supervisor of Elections precincts²




▶ Political boundaries – DSB and Commissioners Districts³


Who lives in Hernando County?

►Where do people live in Hernando County?




►What language do they speak?4

Hernando has the second-lowest percentage of individuals that speak a language other than English at home (11%). This is significantly less than the Florida average (28%). Approximately 4% of the population speaks English less than "Fairly well"




►What is their age and gender?5




Hernando has one of the greatest proportions of individuals over the age of 65 in the Tampa-St.

Petersburg-Clearwater MSA. At 27 percent, it is only second to Citrus county, which has over one third of population over 65. Approximately 4% of Hernando's residents are over the age of 85, which is greater than the Florida average of 3%.




► Are residents disabled? 6




Slightly over 1/3 of the Hernando County populations over the age of 65 is disabled. This is consistent with the Florida average as well as other counties in the Tampa Bay area. However, Hernando has the second highest percentage of residents over the age of 85 with a disability in the Tampa Bay area, second only to Citrus County.

Within the county, most census tracts have between 10-20% of the population as disabled. Only three census tracts in the county have over 30% of the population as disabled.




►What is the % of veterans? 7




Hernando has the second highest percentage of veterans in the Tampa Bay area, with 14% of our adult population over the age 18 classified as veterans.

▶Income and Poverty Characteristics of Hernando County Residents




Income levels still lag the more urbanized counties in the Tampa Bay Area.
Hernando County has the second-lowest median household and family income, at \$42,274.00 annually per household and \$50,448 per family.


Hernando has the secondhighest percentage of social security income households in the Tampa Bay area, second only to Citrus County. 15% of individuals in Hernando County receive food stamps, and only 2% receive cash assistance.



The percentage of Hernando's population living in Poverty is consistent with both the Florida average and the Tampa Bay region. Slightly less than one-quarter of the county's children live in Poverty, and less than 10% of the elderly population lives in poverty.




▶ Population trends




Hernando County has seen a 7.9% increase in population since the 2010 census. The most significant increases to the population occurred starting in 2015, and population is continuing to increase at approximately 2.3% annually.

Where do people in Hernando County live?




Many Hernando County residents are cost burdened (paying over 30% of their gross monthly income toward housing costs.) In 2016, half of the residents renting in Hernando County were cost burdened; this is consistent with the rest of the counties in the Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater MSA and only slightly lower than the Florida average. Over one third of residents that own their own home were costburdened; this is also consistent with regional and state averages.1



Looking more closely at Hernando County residents, cost burden status varies greatly based on residents' location within the County and income level.

▶ Are they homeowners or renters?




In 2016, there were a total of 70,918 housing units in Hernando County. Of those, approximately 78% were owner-occupied units, and 22% were renter-occupied units.

Most housing units in Hernando County are single family detached units. Approximately one-sixth of all occupied units in Hernando County are mobile homes.

►Age and Size of Housing Stock


Half of the housing units in Hernando County were built between 1980 and 1999. This is greater than all previous years combined (22%). 28% of the housing units in Hernando have been built since 2000.




Business and Industry in Hernando County

► Educational Attainment®

Approximately 87% of Hernando County residents have completed high school. Approximately 16% have received a Bachelor's Degree. Only 5% of residents have received an advanced degree.



►Where do people work in Hernando County?




One-fifth of workers in Hernando County work in service occupations. 11% work in the business field. A total of 15% work in manufacturing, healthcare or information technology.

While Hernando has a slightly smaller business base than the Florida average, other employment fields are consistent with general Florida trends.

► How far is their commute? How do they get to work?10




83% of the Hernando



Retired and Elderly




Hernando County has the highest rate of grandparents raising grandchildren in the Tampa Bay area. 44% of grandparents in Hernando County are raising their own grandchildren. This is significantly higher than the state average of 32%.


School District Facts and Figures:

- The current School District Grade is a B, according to the Florida Department of Education.
- 1603 kindergarteners were enrolled for the 2017-2018 school year, as of October 2017.



The number of students in the Hernando County School District has increased by almost 10,000 students since 1996. This does not account for the number of students in Charter or Private schools also located in the County.

Hernando County has a robust school system, with public, charter, vocational religious, and post-secondary institutions located throughout.






School Locations

502 students were identified as transitional as of August 14, 2017.
