Are You In Need of Help with Prescriptions

Hernando County Health and Human Services realizes that the cost for some medicines are simply too expensive to afford. This is especially hard for uninsured and underinsured resident, however there are programs to help.

Patient Assistance Programs (PAPs), which are created by pharmaceutical companies provide *free* or *discounted* medicines to those who are unable to afford them. Each program has its own qualifying criteria. Many, but not all pharmaceutical companies have PAPs. The manufacturers who have Patient Assistance Programs do so for various reasons. However, all are designed to help those in need obtain their medicines. Each pharmaceutical company established its own rules and guidelines. All have income guidelines, but they vary considerably. Each company selects which drugs are available on their programs and how long a person can receive assistance.

Although no two programs are exactly alike, most require that the applicant complete an application. Some programs require detailed medical and financial information, while others request very little. All require doctor's signature. Certain programs require the doctor complete a portion of the form while others only need a prescription. Most send the medicine to the doctor's office for distribution to the patient while others send the medicine to the pharmacy or certificates to the patients to give to the pharmacist. Most, but not all programs that cover medicines used to treat chronic diseases offer refills.

There are a few that sell generic medication at a fixed price and the lists of medications that they help with changes all the time. There are websites with information about patient assistance programs, some charge a fee while others do not. We encourage individuals to use the following sites:

Youth Programs

CareerSource Pasco Hernando offers a youth program designed to provide eligible 18-24 years of age with a variety of options to learn about career opportunities and to gain the skills necessary to succeed in the workplace. Valuable skills obtained through workshops, skills and abilities assessments, internships, job shadowing, industry tours, exposure to professional environments and short term occupational training, help to increase long-term job prospects. Service Learning Projects are also undertaken for youth to play an active role in improving their community while learning the value of community service. Career exploration, resume, development, interviewing skills, and labor market information are additional services providing youth an advantage in entering the workforce.

Income restrictions may apply. The program provides out-of-school youth, ages 18-24 with barriers to employment (dropout, homeless, runaway, foster child, teen parent, offender, basic skills deficiency.) opportunities to succeed.

Affordable Care Act (ACA) - Open Enrollment

You can enroll in or change 2019 Marketplace health insurance right now. The 2019 Open Enrollment Period runs from **November 1**, 2018 to December 15, 2018.

- •November 1, 2018: Open Enrollment starts first day to enroll, reenroll, or change a 2019 insurance plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace
- •December 15, 2018: Last day to enroll in or change plans for 2019 coverage. After this date, you can enroll or change plans only if you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.
- •January 1, 2019: 2019 coverage starts, if your premiums are paid.


