Purpose and Form Instructions:

The purpose of this form is for the planning agencies to collect information about local and direct federal funds that have been expended on transportation disadvantaged trips. The Commission surveys state agencies directly for similar information, so please do not include monies that pass through state agencies. For example, state funds for the Florida Department of Transportation Section 5311 Program would not be reported (since these are reported to the Commission by the Florida Department of Transportation), but the local match monies and the number of trips would be reported.

Please complete the attached form for each county. This form and instructions may be forwarded to local entities; however, it must be sent in summary form to the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. If the planning agency intends to distribute the reporting form to local entities for completion, the planning agency may consider changing the word "County" to "Program" on the reporting form for clarity purposes. Only one form per county shall be submitted to the Commission.

The deadline to submit the summarized form (one for each county) to the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is September 15, 2019. The actual numbers are for the state fiscal year July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 and are local or direct federal dollars only.

Definitions:

Coordinated Transportation - transportation purchased from the coordinated system.

Direct Federal Funding - monies supplied directly from federal agencies for transportation disadvantaged services, including capital (examples might include Foster Grandparents Program or Head Start).

Local Funding - monies generated locally to purchase services for the transportation disadvantaged (examples include both government and non-government funding, match for the TD grant, farebox, and other local contributions or donations).

One-Way Trip - a unit of service provided each time a passenger enters the vehicle, is transported, and then exits the vehicle. Each different destination would constitute a passenger trip.

Capital – buildings, land, vehicles, or other equipment used for the transportation disadvantaged.

Other - items not included in coordinated transportation or transportation alternatives such as planning.

State Fiscal Year - July 1 through June 30.

Transportation Alternatives - those specific services approved by rule to be acceptable transportation alternatives and as defined in Rule 41-2.015, Florida Administrative Code. The Rule states:

- (1) Any agency purchasing transportation services or providing transportation funding for the transportation disadvantaged with transportation disadvantaged funds shall expend all transportation disadvantaged funds through a contractual arrangement with the community transportation coordinator or an approved coordination provider except as provided in (2) and (3) below.
- (2) When it is better suited to the unique and diverse needs of a transportation disadvantaged person, the sponsoring agency may purchase or provide transportation by utilizing the following alternatives:
 - (a) Privately owned vehicle of an agency volunteer or employee;
 - (b) State owned vehicles;
 - (c) Privately owned vehicle of a family member or custodian;
 - (d) Common carriers, such as commercial airlines or bus; and
 - (e) Emergency medical vehicles.
- (3) The sponsoring agency may utilize other modes of transportation when the community transportation coordinator determines it is unable to provide or arrange the required service. Information pertaining to these denials for service shall be reported by the community transportation coordinator on a quarterly basis or more frequently as specified by the local coordinating board.

INTRODUCTION

Introduction to Hernando County's Transportation Disadvantaged System:

Trans Hernando, a department within Mid Florida Community Services, Inc., operates as the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) for the Transportation Disadvantaged program in Hernando County. As the coordinator, Trans Hernando has the responsibilities to provide transportation to all Hernando County residents in a safe and cost effective manner. System priorities, established by members of a Local Coordinating Board, include the provision of transportation county-wide for medical, nutritional, educational, work, and recreational trips, respectively. Services are for senior citizens (over 60), physically or mentally challenged individuals, and economically or transportation disadvantaged individuals.

The system utilizes a shared ride multi-load approach with guaranteed arrival times to rider destinations. Because many citizens are wheelchair bound, all service fleet vehicles are equipped and in compliance with American with Disabilities Act (ADA) recognized wheelchair lifts and securement devices. Trans Hernando provides physically challenged individuals equal service, appointment guarantees, and fare box fees.

Fare Box Fees:

Non sponsored clients are required to pay a fare box fee. Individual fare box fee is \$5.00 per one way trip. Reduced fare box fees are available and can be applied for by individuals to offset financial hardships.

Office Hours:

Office hours are Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. except County recognized holidays.

Service Hours-Transportation Disadvantaged:

Transportation Disadvantaged service hours are Monday thru Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. except for county recognized holidays.

Scheduling Hours:

Scheduling is provided by telephone Monday thru Friday, excluding County recognized holidays. by calling (352) 799-1510 between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
