## CALL TO ORDER

Chair Eastmond called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

A quorum was declared.

Introductions were made

Proofs of publications of the Notice of Public meeting were entered into the record by Mr. Diez.

#### APPROVAL/MODIFICATION OF AGENDA

**Motion:** Mr. Gordinier made a motion to approve the agenda. Ms. Stampfli seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### **REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES – 1/12/2021**

**Motion:** Mr. Gordinier made a motion to approve the January 12<sup>th</sup> minutes. Mr. Rice seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

## CORRESPONDENCE/INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

#### MPO Office Space

Staff is requesting the MPO Board authorize an extension of their lease with the Hernando BOCC for another one year term. The cost of the annual lease is \$10,131.56 which is reimbursable under the MPO planning grant.

#### MPO Funding Update

The Citrus County BOCC discussed the MPO funding issue at their January meeting and agreed to participate in the operational funding of the MPO beginning in FY 2022. An interlocal agreement is being developed between the two (2) counties and the MPO to finalize the arrangements.

#### Media release from January 25, 2021 MPO meeting

Mr. Diez stated this was a synopsis from the last MPO meeting. There were no questions.

#### DISCUSSION ITEMS

#### FY 2022 -- 2023 List of Priority Projects (LOPPS)

The MPO is required to submit an annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP) to the FDOT prior to October 1st. The MPO brings the LOPP to the committees in the spring to begin review and comment.

The Chairman asked that the LRTP be sent to the committee members to assist in reviewing the LOPP's. Chairman Eastmond indicated it might be easier to determine projects which can be removed before considering the addition of new projects. For example, the state trail rehab and the 581 Safe Routes to School projects and although not 100% complete, they will be wrapping up.

#### FY 2021 -- FY 2022 UPWP - 2<sup>nd</sup> Year Amendment

MPO staff has identified projects proposed for inclusion into the second year update:

- 1. Crystal River Bypass Study
- 2. Resiliency Study (Develop a vulnerability assessment to identify at risk and critical infrastructure)
- 3. Interactive Geographic Information System (GIS) -- Mapping and Enhanced Public communication
- 4. Move funding into task 3.4 (Bicycle/Pedestrian) for Complete Streets Project this will balance funding shift for the Congestion Management Process (CMP)
- 5. Provide funding in task 3.6 to begin Autonomous, Connected, Electric Shared vehicles

(ACES) analysis.

Discussion on project updates, i.e., complete streets and any projects anyone would like added to the LOPP.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

#### FY 2021 -- FY 2022 UPWP Amendment/5305(d)

Florida Department of Transportation examined all program areas to stabilize the work program, maintain financial constraint, and preserve existing projects. As such, a decision was made to modify the FTA 5305(d) grant funding model by fulfilling the 5305(d) grant 20% non-federal share with transportation development credits (TDC) in lieu of state and local cash matches. As a result, changes to the UPWP ahead of the second year update are required prior to approval of the Public Transportation Grant Agreement (PTGA)/5305(d) agreement.

The FY 2021 PTGA agreement has been received in the amount of \$91,108. The following changes to the UPWP are required for the MPO to get the funds under contract:

- 1. Modify budget tables to show soft match and remove local match, and state match column for the FY 2021 allocation
- 2. Complete SF-424 application to reflect \$91,108 grant total
- 3. Approval of the FY 2021 PTGA for execution by the MPO Chairman
- 4. MPO Resolution approving the UPWP amendment

The FY 2021-FY 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was modified to address the change from state and local match to be consistent with the UPWP amendment. The TIP change was considered an administrative modification which does not require formal approval.

It was suggested the TAC recommend MPO Board approve the UPWP Amendment to include the items outlined above.

**Motion:** Mr. Sherman made a motion to recommend the MPO Board approve the UPWP amendment. Mr. Rice seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### FY 2021 FTA Certifications and Assurances

The Federal Transit Administration's (FTA's) FY 2021 Annual Certifications and Assurances were posted on FTA's website on January 15, 2021.

As a recipient of federal funding for transit planning, the Hernando/Citrus MPO must submit the executed FY 2021 Certifications and Assurances to FTA within 90 days from the date of publication.

It is recommended the TAC recommend approval of the FY 2021 FTA Certifications and Assurances to the MPO.

**Motion:** Mr. Rice made a motion to recommend the MPO Board approve the FY 2021 FTA Certifications and Assurances. Ms. Stampfli seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

## CITIZEN COMMENTS

No one from the public was present.

## COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. Diez mentioned meeting with Pasco County staff regarding County Line Road. In addition to adding this project to the LOPP, Mr. Diez plans to recommend that it be added to the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) as well.

Chairman Eastmond referenced the ribbon cutting on March 1<sup>st</sup> for the Pleasant Grove Safe Streets (sidewalk) completion.

Mr. Sherman mentioned local government currently in a difficult situation due to impact fees only being at 3 percent and has not been raised in 5 years.

Ms. Stampfli recommended that a Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) be conducted for TheBus. Ms. Rodriguez mentioned that this would be helpful for Citrus Transit as well. Mr. Diez responded that this could be added to the UPWP update and he will ask his consultant for a cost estimate and more details.

Mr. DeAnnuntis updated the group on the UZURV project with TBARTA and that the trips provided have been steadily increasing and mostly for cross-county trips as was the intent of the service.

Ms. Stampfli mentioned PSTA and HART have partnered to bring you Flamingo Fares Tampa Bay, a new regional fare payment system. More information can be found at: <u>https://www.psta.net/flamingofares/index.html</u>

Mr. DeAnnuntis stated Senate Bill 1130 has been proposed and if passed, would dissolve TBARTA in June 2022. He does not foresee that happening.

Ms. Rodriguez stated they are trying to fill their (Citrus County) Transit Director position.

As required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the UPWP budget document is created every two (2) years and updated in the second year. The document identifies the work tasks of the Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO's) annual transportation planning effort with the proposed budget cost and funding sources.

The funding tables will be adjusted to reflect shifting between tasks and amend the close out balance in the amount of \$803,307 into year 2 of the UPWP. Associated language in the tasks has been updated to support the new projects, and project status updates were included as appropriate. The proposed changes to the UPWP textual portion are provided for review.

The following projects have been included into the second year update:

- a. Crystal River Bypass Study (Task 3.8)
- b. Resiliency Study (Develop a vulnerability assessment to identify at risk and critical infrastructure) (Task 3.6)
- c. Interactive Geographic Information System (GIS) For Mapping and Enhanced Public communication (Task 3.5)
- d. Move funding into task 3.4 (Bicycle/Pedestrian) for Complete Streets Project this will balance funding shift for the Congestion Management Process (CMP)
- e. Provide funding in task 3.6 to begin autonomous, connected, electric shared vehicles (ACES) analysis.
- f. Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) for Citrus Transit System (Task 3.1)

## INTRODUCTION

#### **UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM**

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) describes the transportation planning projects to be performed within the Hernando/Citrus Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) study area which includes planning activities for both the Spring Hill Urbanized Area in Hernando County and the Homosassa Springs – Beverly Hills – Citrus Springs Urbanized Area in Citrus County. The UPWP includes work during the timeframe from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

Pursuant to Titles 23 and 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Chapter 339.175, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and the Federal Transit Act, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022 UPWP is the basis for allocating federal, state, and local funds for transportation planning purposes. The UPWP documents all planning tasks and related activities developed by the MPO and other transportation planning processes.

#### **OVERVIEW OF TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ACTIVITIES**

The Hernando County MPO was formed in 1992 following the designation of the Spring Hill Urbanized Area. In 2014, the newly created Homosassa Springs – Beverly Hills – Citrus Springs Urbanized Area was included in the redesignated, reapportioned and renamed Hernando/Citrus MPO. The MPO study area includes the jurisdictional boundaries of both Hernando County and Citrus County.

#### **Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)**

This UPWP identifies all transportation and related planning activities within the Hernando/Citrus Metropolitan Planning Area during the fiscal years 2021 and ending fiscal year 2022. This UPWP program was developed to serve these specific objectives:

- 1. Define transportation planning activities to meet the transportation needs of local, state, and federal agencies.
- 2. Identify funding sources for planning studies.
- 3. Coordinate transportation planning activities and relationships (both internal and external).
- 4. Promote the wise use of public resources through sound decision-making and interagency coordination.

#### Long Rang Transportation Plan (LRTP)

The LRTP is one of the most important projects that the MPO undertakes. It addresses the state and federal planning requirements that are the MPOs responsibility to carry out a long-range and comprehensive planning process. The 2045 LRTP was adopted by the MPO Board on December 4, 2019. In the development of the 2045 LRTP, the MPO participated in the FDOT District 7 Regional Transportation Analysis (RTA) through its Technical Review Team (TRT). The Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST-Act) compliant Public Participation Plan (PPP) was updated in 2018. The LRTP is implemented through adoption of the Transportation Improvement Program.

#### **Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**

The MPO produces the five-year TIP and ensures coordination between the MPO's LRTP, FDOT Work Program and the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) of the respective county and city governments in the MPO area. The TIP is updated on an annual basis and allocates funding to projects by fiscal year (FY).

#### Public Participation Process (PPP)

The MPO has a continuing commitment to an enhanced PPP to better serve the citizens in the Study Area, consistent with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and Environmental Justice Orders. The FAST-Act replaced the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act (MAP-21) as the current funding and authorizing legislation to govern federal surface transportation spending that was signed into law on December 4, 2015. Consistent with the FAST-Act, the MPO's updated PPP provides the framework for public input at all stages of the planning process.

#### SOFT MATCH

Section 120 of Title 23, U.S.C., permits a State to use certain toll revenue expenditures as a credit toward the non-Federal matching share of all programs authorized by Title 23, (with the exception of Emergency Relief Programs) and for transit programs authorized by Chapter 53 of Title 49, U.S.C. This is in essence a "soft-match" provision that allows the Federal share to be increased up to 100% to the extent credits are available. The "soft match" amount being utilized to match the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funding in the UPWP is 18.07% of FHWA program funds for a total of \$90,860.

#### LOCAL AND REGIONAL PLANNING PRIORITIES

This UPWP addresses the priorities of the Hernando/Citrus MPO, FHWA, FTA and the FDOT. The long range transportation planning process has led the Hernando/Citrus MPO to broaden the scope of focus of its work program so that in addition to traditional large capacity improvement projects for automobiles, improvements, and enhancements for other modes (bicycle, pedestrian, and transit) and for smaller scale projects or programs will be developed and promoted. MPO staff will support partnering cities in various efforts related to trails/sidewalk projects, Safe Route to Schools (SRTS), Transportation Alternative (TA), and Corridor Improvement Studies and Activities.

The level of planning effort called for in this UPWP is tied to changing needs in Hernando and Citrus Counties based on development trends and institutional relationships among the existing transportation planning entities. Significant growth is expected in both Hernando and Citrus counties over the next 25 years. The population and employment forecasts, developed for the LRTP, estimate that Hernando County will have a population increase of 52% by 2045 and an employment increase of 50%. Citrus County's population is expected to increase by 41% by 2045 with an employment increase of 35%.

While the population and employment will be growing, the MPO faces declining transportation revenue from state and federal sources, which is a trend that is likely to continue. Anticipated revenue shortfalls will present challenges in the programming and implementation of needed transportation projects.

The Hernando/Citrus MPO has established a set of goals, objectives, and performance measures, within the LRTP, to provide a basis for performance-based planning that will best serve the community and environment currently and for the future.

These goals are:

- 1. Economy: Support Economic Development.
- 2. Intermodal: Maintain existing transportation system.
- 3. Livability: Preserve, and where possible, enhance social, cultural, physical, and environmental values.
- 4. Mobility: Provide for <u>the multi-modal</u> mobility needs of the community.
- 5. Preservation: Preserve and maintain transportation infrastructure and transit assets.
- 6. Safety: Increase safety for the users of the counties' transportation system.

#### **UPWP PLANNING TASKS**

To facilitate the activities and continue to conduct a successful 3-C (Comprehensive, Cooperative and Continuing) transportation process, the following work tasks have been included in this UPWP:

- Task 1: Administration
- Task 2: Data Collection (2.1 and 2.2)
- Task 3: Project Planning (3.1-3.8)
- Task 4: Regional Coordination
- Task 5: Public Outreach/Participation

#### PLANNING EMPHASIS AREAS 2020

The FDOT Office of Policy Planning develops *Planning Emphasis Areas* on a two-year cycle in coordination with the development of Metropolitan Planning Organizations' respective unified planning work programs. Emphasis areas set planning priorities, support the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP), and give importance to topic areas which MPOs are encouraged to address as they develop their planning programs. Implementation of the seven goals of the FTP requires embracing innovation; extensive collaboration across jurisdictions, modes, and disciplines; an emphasis on customer service; data and performance feedback; and strategic investments for the efficient and effective allocation of resources.

#### FDOT Planning Emphasis Areas

• **Safety** has been a federal planning priority over numerous iterations of the transportation legislation. As stated within the FAST Act planning factors, metropolitan areas should "increase safety for motorized and non-motorized users". The state of Florida has expanded on this concept further by becoming a Vision Zero area, with a stated goal within the FTP of zero fatalities across the state's transportation system. FDOT adopted their Strategic Highway Safety Plan in 2016, which provides more information about how the state intends to address transportation safety in the coming years.

Since the MPOs are being asked to report on and monitor their progress against their adopted safety performance measures, MPOs need to account in their UPWP for the effort necessary to satisfy these federal requirements. Additionally, MPOs are encouraged to consider how to expand upon the level of analysis and reporting required by the performance measurement process to further study their unique safety challenges. This approach may include the identification of safety needs in the MPO's LRTP or TIP, stand-alone safety studies for areas or corridors, or safety considerations within modal planning elements.

- **System Connectivity**. Connectivity is a concept that is emphasized both at the federal and state levels. Within the FAST Act, one of the ten planning factors states, "enhance the integration and connectivity of the transportation system, across and between modes, for people and freight". Within the Florida Transportation Plan, system connectivity is addressed within four different goals.
  - Make our economy more competitive
  - Increase opportunities for access to transit and other modes
  - Provide a more efficient and mobile transportation system
  - Meet the needs of a growing and changing population

A connected system is often more cost-effective and better able to address natural and manmade constraints.

For MPOs, system connectivity should be considered within several contexts. First, MPOs should emphasize connectivity within their boundaries to serve the unique needs of their urban and non-urban jurisdictions. This requires coordination with member jurisdictions to identify their connectivity needs while also understanding how current and future land uses impact or can help augment connectivity. Second, MPOs should consider connectivity beyond their boundaries and emphasize continuity on those facilities that link their MPO to other metropolitan and non-urban or rural areas. Third, connectivity for MPOs should include multimodal linkages that are supportive of both passengers and freight. A connected network supports users traveling by a variety of modes, including first and last mile linkages.

• **Resilience**. With the passage of the FAST Act, resilience was introduced as a federal planning factor: "Improve the resilience and reliability of the transportation system and mitigate stormwater impacts of surface

transportation". Resilience is defined as the ability to adapt to changing conditions and prepare for, withstand, and recover from disruption. These conditions can encompass a wide variety of environmental, technological, economic, or social impacts.

MPOs can address resilience within their planning processes by leveraging tools such as the FHWA Resilience and Transportation Planning guide and the FDOT Quick Guide: Incorporating Resilience in the MPO LRTP. It should be noted that while these documents focus primarily on the development of MPO LRTPs and TIPs, addressing resilience should be a consideration within every planning document prepared by an MPO. MPOs should place a particular emphasis on coordination with agency partners responsible for natural disaster risk reduction, or who may be developing local resilience planning initiatives. Additionally, MPOs should consider the additional costs associated with reducing vulnerability of the existing transportation infrastructure. Proactive resiliency planning will help the MPO develop planning documents that are ultimately more realistic and costeffective.

ACES (Automated/Connected/Electric/Shared use) Vehicles. According to the Federal Highway Administration, "Transportation is in the midst of disruptive change from new technologies (automated and connected vehicles); new institutions (shared mobility firms); and changing attitudes (reduced car ownership). Across the nation, transportation planners are under pressure to develop performance-oriented policies, plans, and investment decisions that consider an increasingly complex transportation landscape. In the process, planners need to consider, but cannot yet reliably predict, the potential impact of disruptive and transformational Connected Vehicle (CV) and Automated Vehicle (AV) technologies on safety, vehicle ownership, road capacity, VMT, land-use, roadway design, future investment demands, and economic development, among others. While some forms of CV and AV are already being deployed across the United States, significant unknowns exist regarding the rate of technology adoption, which types of technologies will prevail in the marketplace, the interaction between CV/AV vehicles and various forms of shared mobility services, and the impacts of interim and widespread levels of CV/AV usage."

Adopting and supporting innovative technologies and business practices supports all seven goals of the Florida Transportation Plan and the federal planning factors found in the FAST Act. ACES may lead to great improvements in safety, transportation choices, and quality of life for Floridians, our visitors, and the Florida economy. Though there is a great deal of speculation and uncertainty of the potential impacts these technologies will have, MPOs need to determine how best to address the challenges and opportunities presented to them by ACES vehicles.

#### **Federal Planning Emphasis Areas**

For 2020, the FHWA and FTA have not issued any new Planning Emphasis Areas (PEA). They actively encourage MPOs and the states to develop and identify work tasks associated with the PEAs in their UPWP's. The Federal Planning Emphasis Areas are as follows:

- 1. Support the **economic vitality** of the metropolitan area, especially by enabling global competitiveness, productivity and efficiency Increase the safety.
- 2. Increase the **safety** of the transportation system for motorized and non-motorized users.
- 3. Increase the **accessibility and mobility options** available to people and for freight.
- 4. Protect and enhance the **environment**, promote **energy conservation**, improve **quality of life**, promote **consistency** between transportation improvements, state and local planned growth and economic development patterns.
- 5. Enhance the **integration and connectivity** of the transportation system, across and between modes, for people or for freight.
- 6. Promote efficient system management and operation.
- 7. Emphasize the **preservation** of the existing transportation system.
- 8. Increase the **security** of the transportation system for motorized and nonmotorized users.
- 9. Consider the **resiliency and reliability** of the transportation system and reduce or mitigate **storm-water impacts.**
- 10. Enhance **travel and tourism**.

#### **OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES AND BYLAWS**

The Hernando/Citrus MPO is an independent, separate legal entity authorized pursuant to Florida Law. The MPO operates under a duly adopted set of bylaws adopted July 15, 2014. MPO staff as well as Hernando County, per the staff services agreement, provides administrative, legal, financial, purchasing, and personnel support. The MPO Board consists of nine (9) voting members representing five (5) local governments and one non-voting representative from the FDOT. The Board is comprised of local elected officials and has the responsibility to develop and adopt plans, and to recommend improvement priorities for the transportation system.

Additionally, the MPO has three standing Advisory Committees. These are the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), and the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC). The TAC and CAC will meet a minimum of four times per year. The BPAC routinely meets on a quarterly basis as well. Each committee has its own set of bylaws and review work tasks prior to MPO Board action.

The Hernando/Citrus MPO is the designated planning agency to receive Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) Trust Funds utilized for planning activities of the TD program. The MPO staffs two (2) TD Local Coordinating Boards (LCB), one for Hernando County, and one for Citrus County.

## **WORK PROGRAM**

#### TASK 1: ADMINISTRATION

#### Purpose

### TASK 2: DATA COLLECTION

#### Purpose

## TASK 3: PROJECT PLANNING

# **3.2:** Transportation Disadvantaged Coordination

#### Purpose

Serve as the Designated Official Planning Agency (DOPA) for the Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) Programs for Hernando and Citrus Counties. The MPO assists the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD), the Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Boards (LCB), and the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) by optimizing services to the elderly, handicapped, and those who qualify under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and any other transportation disadvantaged individuals.

# **Previous Work**

# 3. FY 2021-FY 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)/State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Amendment

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has requested that the MPO Board amend the FY 2021-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add design funds to add lanes to US 301 from Pasco County Line to SR 50/Cortez Boulevard (2 to 4 lanes).

The purpose of this project is to support economic development by improving goods movement access and connections to transportation facilities / major activity centers and improve safety by reducing transportation-related crashes, injuries and fatalities. The TIP/STIP amendment adds preliminary design funds to develop concepts in conjunction with the Project Development and Environmental (PD&E) Study.

The FDOT has provided the MPO with the TIP/STIP amendment to execute. It will be scheduled for the May 13, 2021, meeting for approval.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended the TAC recommend the MPO Board approve the TIP/STIP Amendment to add the US 301 project from Pasco County Line to SR 50/Cortez Blvd. into the FY 2021-FY 2025 program.

#### JOINT MPO/FDOT CERTIFICATION SUMMARY

#### Hernando-Citrus Metropolitan Planning Organization

The annual Joint FDOT/MPO Certification for January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, review was conducted on March 29, 2021, as required by federal guidelines to assess the MPO's compliance with the federal transportation planning process and applicable state laws. The Hernando-Citrus MPO was found in compliance with federal and state guidelines for metropolitan transportation planning.

The following is a summary of the Department's findings:

#### **Notable Achievements**

#### • Agency Coordination

- The MPO has continued coordination with the Florida Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) and the M-CORES initiative, along with Citrus County for the extension of the Suncoast Parkway north through Citrus County.
- The MPO has continued coordination with FDOT, OGT and local agencies for the regional SUNTrail projects in our study area (C2C, Heart of Florida Loop, Nature Coast to Peace River).
- The MPO is moving forward with a Complete Streets Program Implementation Plan and Process. The MPO website was updated to be more user-friendly and visually appealing
- All documents posted to the website are ADA compliant.
- MPO Staff has increased usage of social media platforms (twitter, Facebook) to broaden the reach for providing information to the public.

#### **Recommended Actions**

- The MPO should continue to work on financial stability including: invoice timeliness/accuracy and better utilize FHWA and FTA funds.
- MPO should investigate meeting location options that would support virtual participation.

- The MPO Board appointed Mr. Walter "Bud" Osborn to the Citrus County Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (LCB) to fill the Veterans Services Representative position.
- Ms. Cara Lee Brunk, with The Department of Elderly Affairs, was appointed to both the Hernando County Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (TDLCB) and to the LCB as the agency representative.
- The MPO Board appointed Ms. Shavonna Maci Reid to the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), filling the Minority Representative position for Citrus County at large. Ms. Reid's appointment will expire on 3/18/2023.
- The request to extend the MPO's lease agreement with Hernando County BOCC/Building Division for office space was authorized by the MPO Board for a period of one year.
- MPO staff presented the MPO Board with project suggestions for incorporation into the second year update of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) FY 2021-2022 which will be formally reviewed and approved on May 13, 2021. The MPO Board endorsed including a Crystal River Bypass Study, a Resiliency Study, an Autonomous, Connected, Electric, Shared Vehicles (ACES) review and update for the MPO Study Area, and an Interactive Geographical Information System (GIS) for Mapping and Enhanced public communication project. This authorization also includes moving funds into task 3.4 for the Complete Streets Project, balancing the funding shift for the Congestion Management Process (CMP).
- The MPO Board approved an Amendment to the FY 2021-2022 UPWP to remove the local match and state match funds from FY 2021 5305(d) grant funding. An associated grant application and Public Transportation

Grant Agreement (PTGA) were approved consistent with the amendment in the amount of \$91,108.

- The FY 2021 Certifications and Assurances for the Federal Transit Administration were approved by the MPO Board which is an annual requirement as a recipient of federal transit funds. MPO staff was authorized to proceed with finalization in the Federal Transit Administration's electronic systems as required.
- The MPO Board canceled their April meeting by consensus.

#### Annual Update to List of Priority Projects (LOPP)

Every year, the MPO is required to submit an annual list of Priority Projects (LOPP) to the FDOT prior to October 1. The MPO's LOPPs comprise Transportation Alternative (TA) Priority Projects, and a Major Improvement Priority List. The FY 2021/2022 LOPPs were approved by the MPO on July 9, 2020 and provided to the FDOT for development of their Tentative FY 2022-FY 2026 Work Program.

The LOPPs are typically provided to the committees and MPO in the spring to begin review and refinement. Although the submittal date is October 1, 2021 for the new LOPPs, the FDOT encourages the MPO to provide them earlier if possible.

MPO staff will be proposing the addition of 2 projects to the Major Project LOPP for Hernando County which include 2 segments of County Line Road, (addition of 2 lanes) and US 301 from Pasco County Line to SR 50 (addition of 2 lanes).



Note: Includes projects funded for construction by 2024.





Figure 10. Roadway Network Existing + Committed (Citrus County) – Tier 1

#### Figure 11. Roadway Network Cost Feasible Interim Plan (Hernando County) – Tier 2 (2025 – 2035)





Figure 12. Roadway Network Cost Feasible Interim Plan (Citrus County) – Tier 2 (2025 – 2035)



#### Figure 13. Roadway Network Cost Feasible Plan (Hernando County) – Tier 3 (2036-2045)





Figure 14. Roadway Network Cost Feasible Plan (Citrus County) – Tier 3 (2036-2045)



#### Figure 15. Roadway Network Unfunded Needs (Hernando County) – Tiers 4 & 5




Figure 16. Roadway Network Unfunded Needs (Citrus County) – Tiers 4 & 5







#### Figure 23. Existing and Committed Bikeways and Trails (Citrus County)
