Impact of Hope Florida

Individuals Receiving Public Assistance:

- 57% of participants on public assistance had a reduction or eliminated their reliance for assistance.
- 7,748 participants on public assistance had a reduced reliance for assistance.
- 17,063 participants on public assistance are no longer relying on assistance.

- 60% of participants in the Hope Florida program who identified housing as a barrier found more stable housing.
- Of the participants who identified child care as a barrier more than 63% were able to find long-term support.
- 69% of participants received services to help meet basic needs.



Danielle's Story

In 2023, Danielle, a 21-year-old single mom, was referred to the Hope Florida – A Pathway to Prosperity initiative and immediately connected with a Hope Navigator.

Danielle shared with her Hope Navigator that she had been working at a company for two years, but had been laid off after requesting maternity leave. Due to her sudden unemployment, she was unable to pay for baby items, her cell phone bill, and car insurance.

Danielle's Hope Navigator utilized the rolodex of local community partners to contact the Second Chance Society, who was able to cover her car insurance bill.

Next, the Hope Navigator sent out an alert for the outstanding needs through CarePortal. A member of Hollywood Community Church saw the CarePortal request and provided Danielle with a baby monitor, diapers, wipes, and paid her outstanding cellphone bill.

Danielle's Hope Navigator was able to assist by removing her most immediate barriers. The Hope Navigator is now working hand-in-hand with Danielle to achieve her long-term goal of becoming a dental Assistant, pointing her towards a path to self-sufficiency.




¿Qué es Hope Florida?
